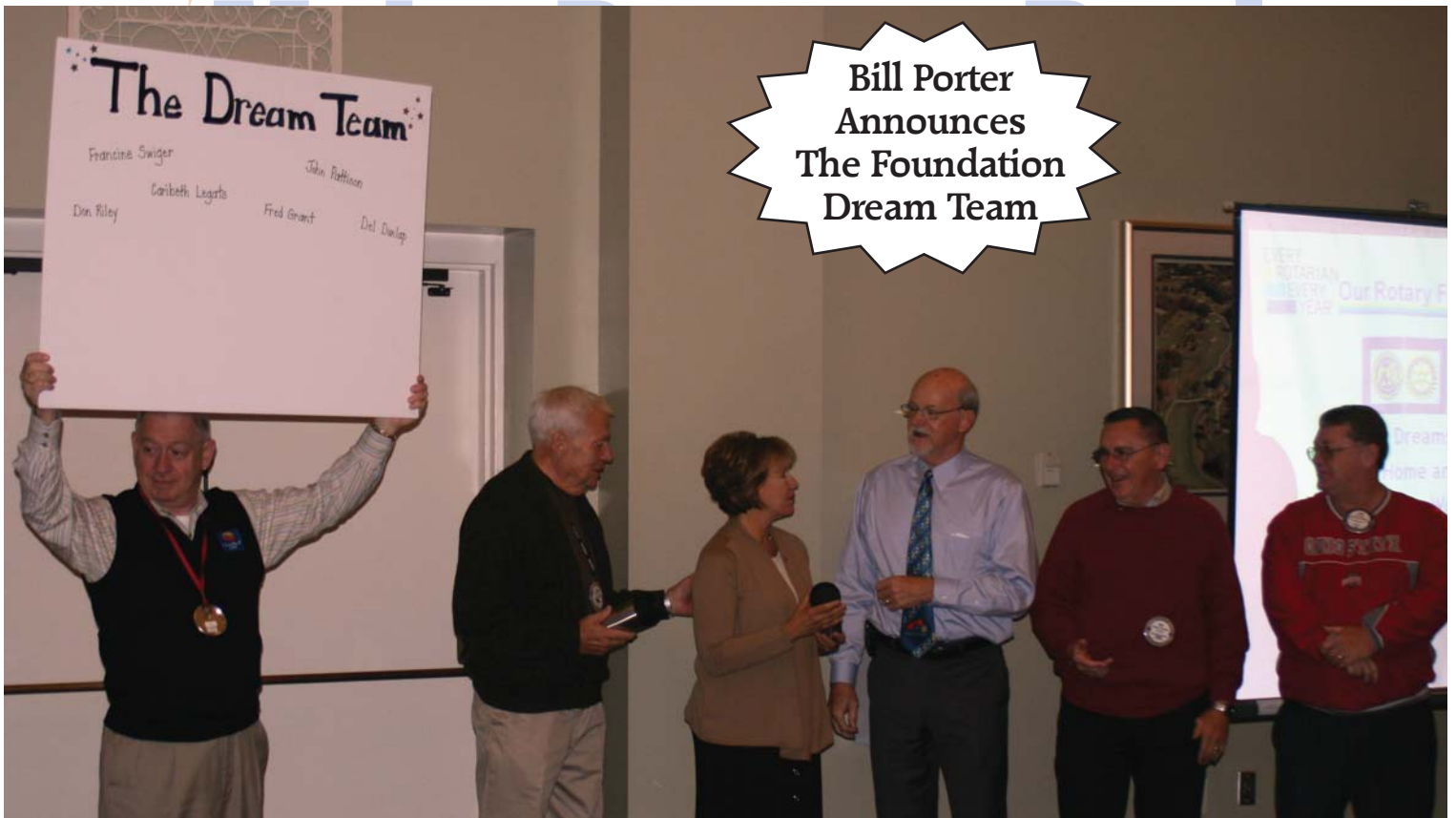

Brent told us that there are 4000+ members in Rotary in our 6690 District. Our efforts in Rotary International help in the achievement of world understanding and peace through local, national and international humanitarian, educational and cultural programs.

We have many grants that help people annually. In 6690, we gave over \$262,000 to RI. Those efforts go towards many things. One big thing it goes toward is the Polio Plus efforts. We are making headway, however, there are places where Polio was eradicated but came back because of people coming into the country bring the disease back.

Terry Davis, M.D., works on an orphanage in Rafiki, Nairobi that houses children who have lost their parents to AIDS. Money has been given to this effort to help them start a grain mill to help provide food not only for themselves, but also allow them a way to make money in the community.

Ram Gawande M.D., does eye surgery in India. It costs about \$35 a person and the Athens Club has taken on this effort to help those who cannot see.

Our club did the grant to get the sewing machines to the women of Ugandan. These women make such beautiful things and this allows them to have a way to make money for their families.

On happy notes, some of these projects after getting up and running say that they do not need help anymore because they have become self-sufficient. That is a truly happy time for not only Rotary but also for the people and families involved.

In ending, please think about how you can help. \$100 dollars can go far in Rotary with the matching grants and with how we invest our funds. Your \$100 dollars can also go towards your Paul Harris Fellow. So please consider helping the Foundation out.

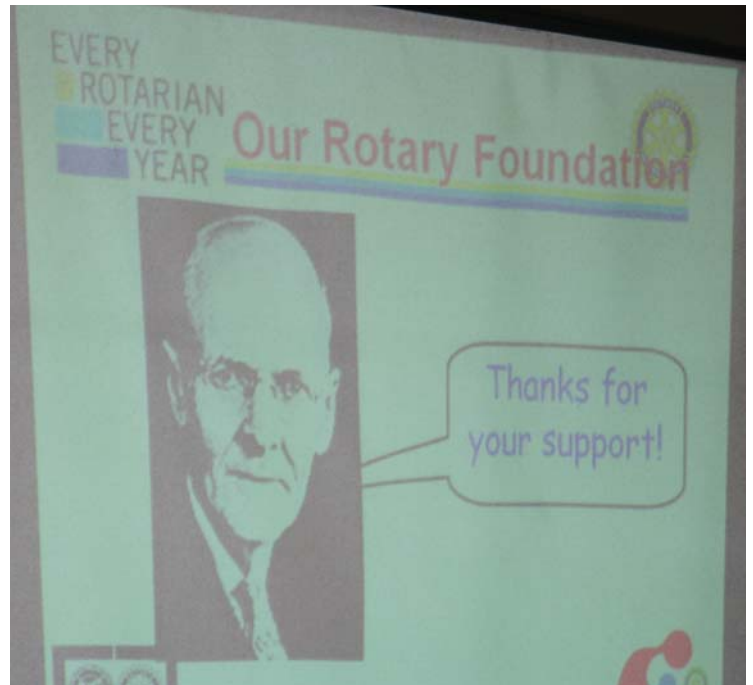

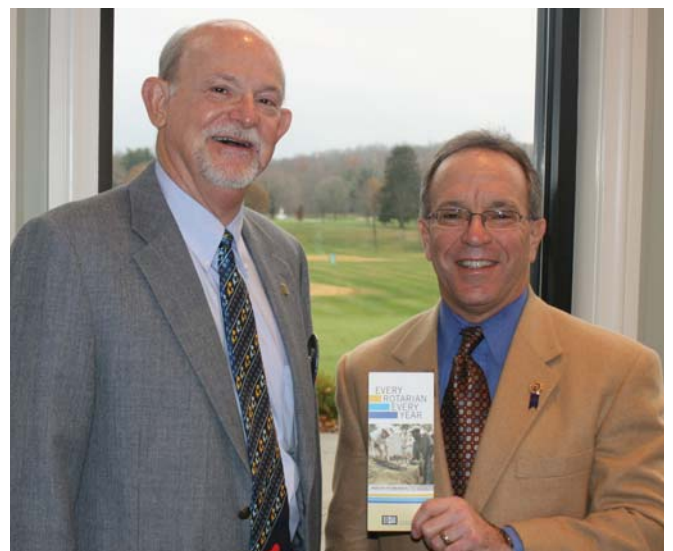
