Main Speaker - Sandy Grizzard

President John then called Caribeth forward to introduce this morning's speaker, Sandy Grizzard. She started by telling us that she first came to Zanesville in 1955 when her father moved her family here, as he was the manager at the Kroger store. Her mom will be 92 this month. She graduated from Zanesville High and has four grown children, 2 girls and 2 boys and 7 grandkids.

She worked for Bank Ohio and First Federal and was there to open up the first check accounts. At First National, she worked as a teller and then became a Supervisor on the 1st floor. She brought Brink's Security to First National because before that, high school students were the runners for the bank. As Supervisor, she did not want to see something happen to those students when they were running the money. They could have been robbed or possibly gotten into a car accident while transporting the money.

In 1994, she began working at Merrill Lynch for the Moyer Group. She worked there for 13 years before retiring in 2008. While there, she became known as the Chocolate Lady because she was addicted to Hershey Bars. She always had chocolate bars in the office in a fil-
