Ward Mitzel introduced Jay and Lori Wince, proprietors of Weasel Boy Brewery. Weasel Boy Brewery is the first micro brewery in Zanesville and will produce 300 barrels this year. Jay had been a home brewer for 13 years and is employed at Mid Ohio Bakery. Lori is a native of Newark and is in the newspaper business. Together they opened the award winning

Jay shared information about American brews. Beer is the most popular alcoholic beverage being the beverage of choice for Americans who consume alcohol. 6 billion gallons of beer are produced in America each year. Prohibition closed almost all of the breweries in America including the former August Bond Brewery which was formerly on Marietta Street. Post prohibition saw the arrival of a lighter lager which has a lighter body and less taste. Legislation in 1978 gave impetus to the craft beer movement. Currently there are over 1,500 small independent traditional breweries. Independent brewers have about 4% of the market share and are continuing to gain. They are pushing traditional styles and are developing such brews as peanut butter, chocolate, coffee, and fruit.

Weasel Boy participated in the 2008 Great American Beer Festival in Denver. They are expanding their tap room which will double seating capacity and are now serving flat bread pizza in conjunction with a local café. They also offer wines from two area wineries. Jay closed with the thought that there is a beer for every mood and a mood for every beer.
